Assistance payments are made to the Permanent Care family to assist with the day to day expenses of caring for a child/young person. Assistance payments are considered to be a reimbursement for expenses and not an earned income.

The children have been busy developing social skills through play, they are learning how to take turns, share, negotiate space and to be considerate of their peers and their feelings. This process can be challenging, that is why staff monitor the children's progress and will model behaviour and help provide tools for our children when required.



We were very excited to harvest tomatoes from our garden bed, the children decided they would like to make a pasta sauce. The sauce was delicious served on pasta with a sprinkle of cheese.



Baby Jett came to kinder for his bath time, the children were fascinated and loved helping to wash Jett. We discussed hygiene and talked a lot about growth making comparisons/ observations between baby Jett and ourselves. For example we were a lot bigger than Jett, had more hair, can sit up on our own etc.



Sometimes and everyday foods are an ongoing discussion we have at Kinder, promoting healthy eating. We have a magnet board with a sometimes and everyday column, the children discuss amongst themselves where they think they should place their wrappers.

I would just like to remind parents to make sure they send a change of clothes in their children's bags and remember to send hats.
