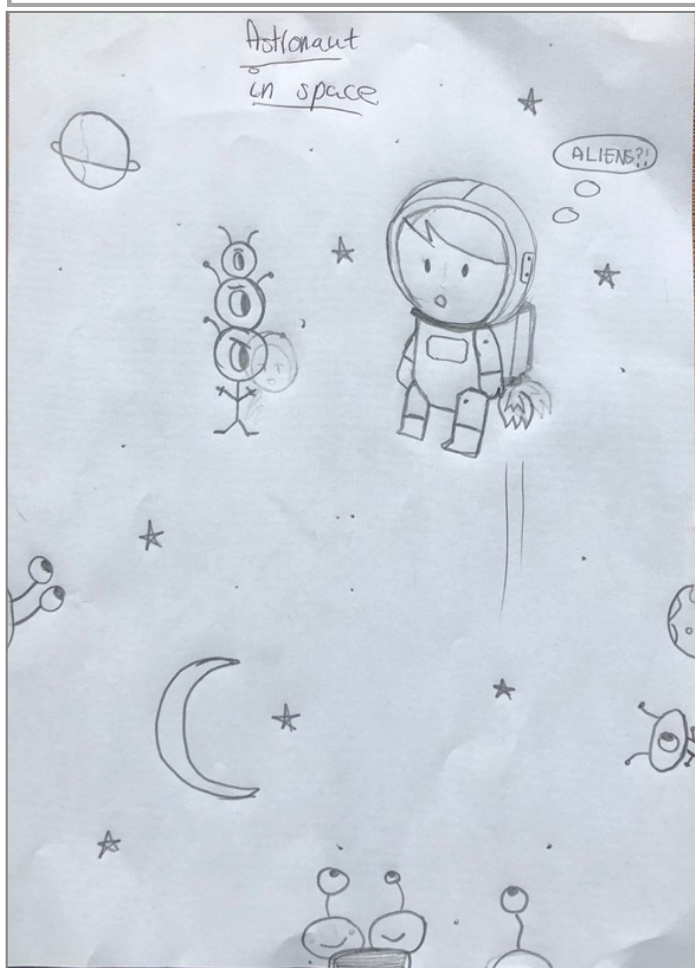

The term is passing us by at a rapid speed, very busy unusual times. We hope you are all taking care of yourselves and those close to you.

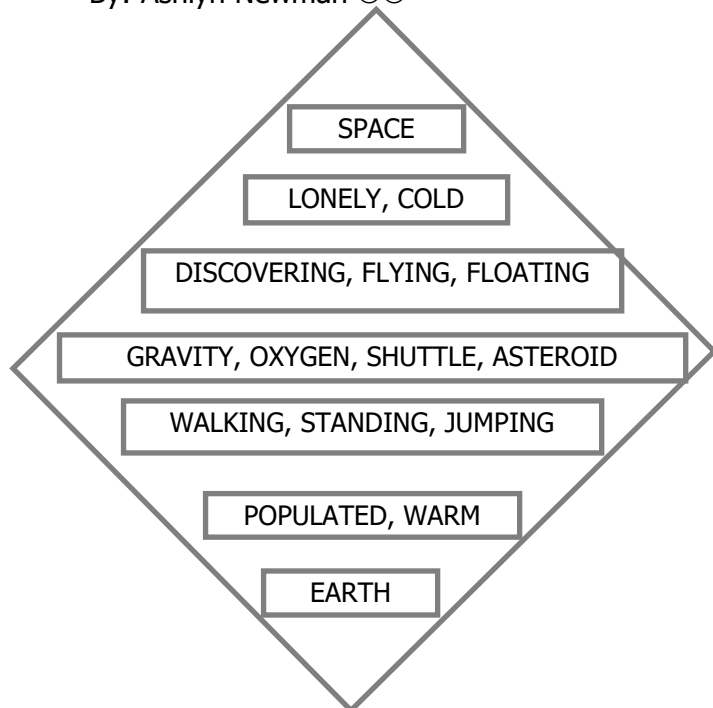
