Principal's Report Term 3 Week 5 - 2019

The term is at the half way mark now and there is so much to fit in between now and the break, so exciting! We are now in full School Concert prep mode and the acts are coming along nicely. We are still looking for a parent item so come on, time to access your creative side ya'all! The Fun Run was another great success and thanks to all the families who raised money for the cause. We will know soon if we have raised enough to add a flying fox to the playground! Most of our Grade 6's went into Alexandra Secondary College yesterday for the next stage of their transition program. They had a great time whilst on site and are one step closer to that next part of their education journey. Mrs Crowle is at a professional learning day today completing the next part of her Leading Literacy for Networks course. This is a quality course and Mrs Crowle has gained and shared some great ideas with our whole staff. These are now benefiting the students through our programs. We had a great day at Lake Mountain last week. There was hardly anyone up there but the training areas had plenty of snow for our beginning skiers to learn this challenging skill. By the end of the day, a number of the kids were really getting quite good at skiing. We have organised a Cluster Ski Day this year and some of the students are going to Lake Mountain again next Tuesday to hone their skills even further with some fun activities and races.

Thanks to all families who have been letting us know when their students are not well enough to come to school. It can be done with a phone call, text, email, note or FlexiBuzz. We understand there are a lot colds getting about at the moment but it is great to get written confirmation. School staff will make a phone call at 9:30am if there is an unexplained absence on the day.

There are a number of camps on the horizon. Somers, Waratah Beach, Old Men Young Mountains. Please ensure all forms are returned promptly and payments are made on time. The Somers Camp has had a huge number of applicants from across the district this year so we may not get our usual allocation. If we get our forms back sooner this will help in the application process.

SRC are having their Cupcake Day on Monday to raise money for the RSPCA. This will be a fun day for our students and it is great to see our SRC mobilising for such a worthwhile cause. Thanks in advance to Kylie and the parent helpers involved.

The Shire is still looking for a qualified person to take on Before and After School Care at Eildon Primary. If anyone knows of someone who has a relevant qualification in this area (i.e. Cert III in Children's Service), please let the school office know.

We are looking at having some of the concrete areas around the school replaced as some of the sections are either missing, raised, sunken, damaged or still piped. This will increase the safety around the school and also make the grounds look a lot tidier. This will take place in stages and take roughly a year to complete. We had a burst pipe in the Kindergarten last week. This has been

repaired and the side entrance to the school is now a lot less muddy!

The school is going through an OHS audit at the moment and The Department has allocated an OHS officer to come out to the school to help with the preparation. We had our first meeting this week and Peter was very impressed with where the school was at in this space. We have made substantial progress as a result. Much of the work has already been done but we have a few administration tasks still to complete which will happen in the next two weeks.

Many thanks to Kevin Tappe for removing the rocks from the garden at the front of the school today. We will now be able to start having PE activities out there which will be very exciting for the students.

Jam Hot Music continues to be a great program at the school providing musical opportunities to many of our students. A reminder to parents to keep up to date with their payments. Miss Mangelsdorf has organised an excursion to UGFM for our whole school. This will take place in two weeks. Notes will be sent out next week. This is a great opportunity to consolidate the amazing learning that has taken place around our inquiry theme The Media this term.

Our goal for this year is to raise money for the purchase of a "FLYING FOX" FOR OUR PLAYGROUND.






