Murrindindi Shire Council Electoral Structure Review

The Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) is reviewing the electoral structure of Murrindindi Shire Council and wants your input.

The review, known as an electoral representation review, will examine the electoral structure of the local council to ensure it provides fair and equitable representation for all voters. The review will look at:

- whether the local council has the appropriate number of councillors
- whether the local council should be unsubdivided, with councillors elected from the whole local council, or subdivided into wards and if subdivided, the number of wards, ward boundaries, and the number of councillors per ward.

Public input is a vital part of the review process, providing valuable local perspectives and knowledge. The VEC has prepared a submission guide to help in preparing submissions.

The VEC will also host public information sessions for anyone interested in finding out more about the review. The sessions will be held at:

- 7.00 pm on Monday 1 July at Alexandra Council Chambers, 28 Perkins Street, Alexandra
- 7.00 pm on Tuesday 2 July at Kinglake Community Centre, 436 Whittlesea-Kinglake Road, Kinglake.
