Students are progressing nicely with their reading thanks to the great programs being run in classrooms. Our library renovation is now finished and we have had much positive feedback about the new feel to this important school space. We will be receiving some more new books in coming weeks and we may need to purchase another mobile shelf to help store them all.

We enjoyed an amazing visit from the extraordinary bands of De La Salle College Malvern this week. They performed a number of enchanting items, none more so than the Song of the Lonely Mountain. Their choir and instrumentalists combined magnificently to convey a performance quite unparalleled. A REMINDER TO COMPLETE THE PARENT OPINION SURVEY BY 11TH AUGUST!!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school.

The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. <u>A letter has been distributed to parents with full details to access the website including the school PIN code required.</u> All responses to the survey are anonymous.

This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday 22nd July to Sunday 11thAugust.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **10-15 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September. Results from the Parent Survey will be used for future direction of the school.


