Principal's Report Term 4 Week 1 - 2019

It has been a great start to Term 4 and the students have settled back nicely into the school routine.

The new Flying Fox and Parallel Bars have been a big hit and the students have been giving them a great workout testing their physical strength and gymnastic skills. There have been some lovely games being played in the yard too such as skipping, dodge-ball, sandpit canals, footy and even hopscotch!



We have a busy term lined up. Our term value is **'Achievement'** and we are particularly emphasising the process aspect of the value.

Our Inquiry Theme is **Life Cycles** and we have already begun looking at how living things change throughout their lives and how they often depend on other organisms and their environments to survive.

Today students enjoyed a fantastic incursion at the Eildon Community Centre. The event was in conjunction with The Eildon Boat Show. The day involved a number of activities held by groups involved in boating and fishing in our area. Fishcare, Marine Safety Victoria, Goulburn Murray Water, Parks Victoria, SES, AGL and Fisheries Victoria all attended. The students enjoyed rotating through the activity stations which included: a casting clinic, a lifejacket safety session, an irrigation workshop, Power station information session, Junior Ranger introduction, Care for Cod coloring activity and more. It was a great day that was well-organised and the students learnt so much about their local environment and some of the industries in our marvellous area.

Earlier in the week we had Bravehearts at the school. The students learnt a lot about personal safety and what to do when you are unsure. This is a part of our commitment to implement the Child Safety Standards.

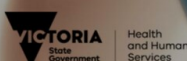

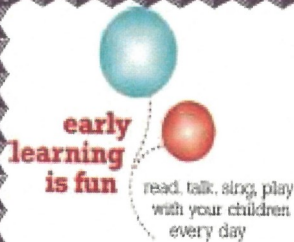
