Principal's Report Term 2 Week 8 - 2019

Sounds like a nice, long weekend was had by all as we head into the last few weeks of term!

Thanks to those families who have shown an interest in accessing Before and After School Care at Eildon Primary School. It seems like there is sufficient demand for this kind of service and we will be taking the next steps now towards putting it in place.

The students are playing very creatively in the yard at the moment and at any one time you will see a vast number of different structured games taking place. This is a credit to the kids and to the teachers who have been modelling different games for students to play and who regularly coach the kids in game rules. Keep up the great work everyone!

Mrs Hall is taking the staff back over the BigWrite/VCOP writing approach that was responsible for so much growth in our writing over the past few years. Mrs Hall is very passionate about this approach which all of our teachers really enjoy using. They will attend further professional learning sometime in the near future. The BigWrite sessions usually occur every fortnight where students write uninterrupted for about 40mins. There is a focus to the session and students learn to edit and assess their own and their buddy's writing afterwards. We thank Mrs Hall for her insightful leadership during our PLT staff meetings.

Some of you may have noticed that our chicken coup is now completely built thanks to Peter the Chaplain and our Gr 6 boys. The three chickens for our chicken coup have been ordered and will arrive next Friday 21st June. The next challenge will be to ensure they are regularly fed and watered and what to do with the eggs. This will not be a problem through the week obviously as the students will manage that part. However, on weekends and school holidays it will be nice to know there are people around to help with this task. If you are willing to take on such a role even for just one of the holiday weeks each year, please let the office know.
