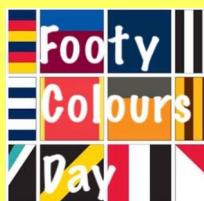

By participating in the remote learning, families are helping to sustain the momentum of their child's education and they are also enhancing student wellbeing during this difficult circumstance. 

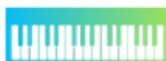
