## WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training. designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school student behaviour climate. and Our school will use the survey engagement. results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All parents will be invited to participate in this year's survey. A letter will be distributed to parents on Monday with full details to access the website including the school PIN code required. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> July to Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> August.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes 10-15 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, English. Mandarin, Chin (hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali. Turkish. Punjabi and Greek.

The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September.

Results from the Parent Survey will be used for future direction of the school.

# Kindergarten Report - 19th July, 2019

Welcome back to a very cold and wet start to term 3. The children have been very excited to discover we have a supermarket at Kinder. They are enjoying roles as the cash register Officer, self stocker and the customer. This is a great opportunity to polish up on numeracy skills and knowledge, such as identifying numbers in their written forms.

As I have already mentioned it has been a cold start to the term and there are a lot of nasty bugs going around, so if your child is unwell please keep them home.














### Alexandra Junior Soccer Club
