## 6 STONKERS RETURN TO GOULBURN 2021 FOR OPENING

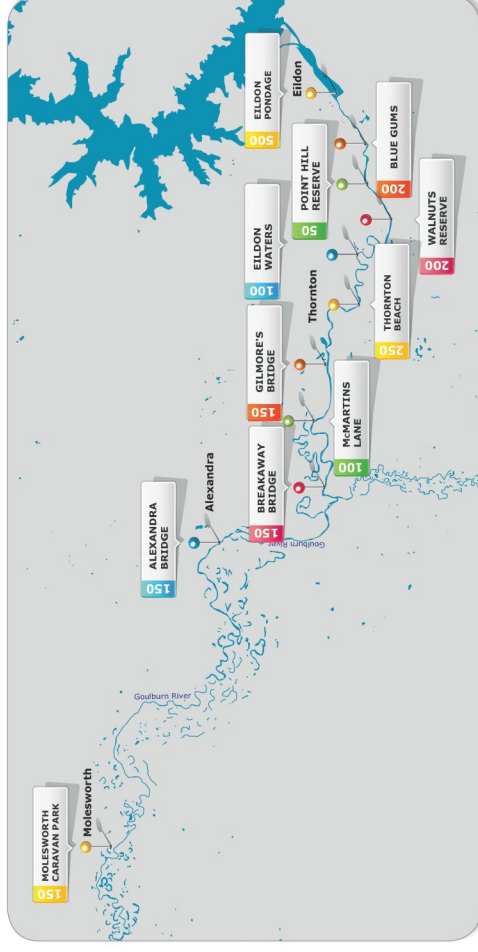
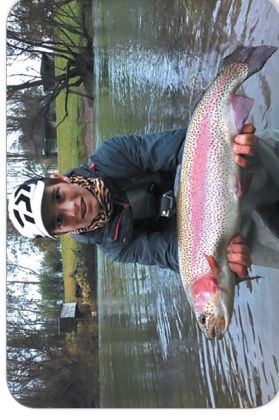
### CATCH A TROPHY TROUT
