Principal's Report Term 4 Week 1 - 2020

Well it has been a very wet start to the term but the students have settled back in beautifully. There has been much joy in the playground especially, as students reconnect with each other and the school after our recent second round of remote learning.

Most of the building works have now been completed. The Kindergarten has had one of its walls and much of the flooring rebuilt as well as all of its windows replaced along the Centre Ave side. The Seniors Room is back in action with the water damage being almost fully repaired now (a small section of new iron will go on the roof in the near future). New mounts have been installed under the Air Conditioner Inverters and all split systems have been cleaned and repaired. Much of the painting is now complete with just a few areas to be finished up next week. There are many other minor works that have been done e.g. (new windows in all entrance doors) and still some more to do (new highlight windows above the coverway, pergolas to be painted, High St entrance resurfacing, MPR entrance paving, school oval surfacing etc.). All in all, the school is looking so much better as a result of the Maintenance Blitz and the students and staff are very happy with the results!

Our focus for Term 4 will be on **Wellbeing** – students, staff, families. This ties in well with our Inquiry Theme 'Celebrations' especially as we start to roll on into Christmas. Having said that, we will also be starting to regain the significant **Achievement** momentum we had established prior to remote learning. This can be facilitated tremendously by families completing their nightly reading.

At this stage, our COVID-19 Policy is still in place and I would like to thank families for their Cooperation with this matter. In summary, we require families to:

- values remain off the school grounds unless absolutely necessary
- on not loiter in the carpark at drop off / pick up
- social distance, sanitise, wear masks (parents)
- keep students with symptoms at home

At school, we will continue to have extra-cleaning in place and no school events such as Assemblies.

We are currently replacing the PCs in the Senior Room with new Laptops. As a result, the PCs have been wiped and decommissioned. They are available to families for purchase. If your family could use a very good PC, please contact the General Office – price negotiable! There is also much garden mulch and Breakfast Club food in the MPR. Please let us know if you could use any, you will be doing us a favour.

Many of you will be aware that the Shire has finalised their plans for the redevelopment of the parkland around the swimming pool. They are now submitting their funding application which we hope will be approved so that our students have the benefit of the great additions that have been included. A reminder that hats are to be worn from Term 4.

I would like to welcome a new family to the school community. The Kool family have recently commenced at Eildon Primary School and Griffin and Phoenix have settled into their new school wonderfully well. It has been great to see their peers making them feel so welcome and we have been impressed by their friendly nature and the amazing skills and experiences they bring to our community. Welcome guys!!

Eildon Kindergarten Report 9 October 2020

Our first week back for Term 4 was full of activity!

Everyone was so happy to see each other again and settled back in beautifully. At this time of year we can really see the strong bonds and great friendships that have developed over the course of the year. The friendships your children are making create a sense of belonging and security, helping them to find new areas of interest and boost their confidence in every day situations/new situations.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, we are still unable to provide any cooking activities, but this hasn't stopped the learning happening. The mud kitchen has been a favourite this week, where children set up a café and use the natural resources and their imaginations, to create lots of delicious looking food. They also created menus which introduced literacy into their play. We set up some sensory play activities, mixing/pouring/measuring with different ingredients bringing numeracy into the play, which they really enjoyed.

The flower arrangement table was also very popular. This involved the children sorting colours, counting flowers and placing the correct number of flowers into numbered pots. At one stage there was a flower shop set up inside with cash register and money (that the children had made). This helped students develop concepts of money, identify numbers in written forms and use language in a shopkeeper/customer context.

Next week, we will begin setting up the home corner as a hospital. If you have anything at home or from your workplace that could contribute to our hospital corner, it would be greatly appreciated.




