Principal's Report Term 3 Week 5 - 2020

We have noticed the days starting to get a little warmer this week and hope that everyone in our school community has managed to get outside for some well-earned exercise and beautiful sunshine.

With COVID19 restrictions tightening across the state recently, the school has gone back to remote learning. All is going well so far and we have seen most of our offsite students during the live video lessons. Please remember if you are unable to complete remote learning on any particular day, to let the General Office know so we can mark your attendance correctly. Thanks to all those parents who have been sending in student work each day to their child's teacher. Please contact your child's teacher through the General Office, if you have any questions regarding your child's learning and/or wellbeing.

The old school building has had quite a bit of work done to it recently and is starting to come back to life. All the doors have been painted, as has most of the panelling (some of which has also been replaced). We are expecting 15 huge, new windows to arrive in the near future. These will be double hung and replace the little white windows that cover the north side of the old school building (facing Centre Ave). The new windows will make a huge difference to the look of the school but they will also improve the lighting conditions of the classrooms and provide much better air ventilation and circulation.

The ceiling in the Seniors Room has been removed due to water damage and will be replaced in the next few weeks, ready for the return of students when restrictions eventually ease. The school oval will also be graded during the September holidays after which time we will be able to utilise this fantastic space.

Thanks to those families who have been participating in the our school fundraiser - The Fun Run. Although it has had to be postponed, we have still been able to raise substantial funds and you may continue to fundraise right up until the event. The students will be looking forward to the anticipated incorporation of a Balance Beam in the playground as a result! Obviously, it has been a challenging year for fundraising and our amazing Parents' Club has not been able to run its usual events. That said, they will definitely be ready to spring back into action when the time comes. We are lucky to have a group of parents who are so committed to supporting the school in this way. Our students have certainly benefited from all the incredibly hard work they have undertaken in recent times.

The staff have been working on developing a new Inquiry Cycle to assist students with the completion of their projects. We are very pleased with the outcome of the work which has culminated in the creation of a very useful poster. Students and staff can refer to this in the classrooms to assist student investigations into the many different topics we cover in our units of Inquiry. Currently, our Inquiry Theme is 'We Make Our Own' and the students have really been enjoying looking at the amazing products we manufacture here in Australia.

School Council met remotely this week and discussed a number of different items (mainly building and grounds). The Student Dress Code Policy was refined slightly also and has been uploaded to the school website (along with all the other school policies).

The Shire has released the final draft of the Eildon Reserve Recreation Strategy. After extensive consultation with the community, the Shire has created a plan that seems to have a little something for everyone. The children are certainly very excited about the skate park, BMX track and all the new climbing equipment that has been included.




HIGHLIGHTING CHILDREN'S WORK FROM HOME



How to Create a Pair of Angel Wings


STEP +


