How to Create a Pair of Angel Wings

In this procedural piece of writing, you will learn to create a pair of angel wings. Once you have created these wings you will be able to scar through the skies. For more information visit our website:

Before constructing these wings you'll need to gather a few common wing-making materials from your garden such as:

- ❖ A strand of yellow mane from your unicorn
- ❖ A container of cloud fluff
- ❖ Three dancing dictionaries
- ❖ And seventeen eucalyptus leaves

Now for the equipment:

- ❖ Three separate mixing bowls
- ❖ A fairys hair-dryer
- ❖ An electric beater
- ❖ And finally, 2 plastic wing moulds



STEP 1

Sensibly situate thirteen of the eucalyptus leaves in one of the metal mixing bowls. Then swiftly pour 3 and a half cups of sweltering water in with the leaves and then blend it with an electric beater.

STEP 2

Seize the second dish and aggressively dispense the container of cloud fluff in before it bites you. Now merrily tear page 37 out of each of the dancing dictionaries. Then rapidly find the word ascertain and cautiously cut it out. The term ascertain will turn the wings black and they won't shimmer. So if you're evil you can leave ascertain in.


STEP 3


STEP 4

Tip bowls one and three into dish two. Then you should see how two form a pair of wings. Make sure to grasp a hold of the wings and blow-dry them before they shrink. Lastly, clip the wings on to your shirt!
