Principal's Report Term 3 Week 9 - 2020

Well, it's been lovely feeling the warmth the last week or so as the planet makes its way back around the other side of the sun.

It has been another very different term but I have been so impressed by the way every member of our school community has bunkered down and managed the challenges of the day.

At this stage, in accordance with Department guidelines, all students will be returning to onsite learning at Eildon Primary School on Monday 12th October. This will be the second Monday of Term 4 as students are not permitted to return any earlier than that date. Therefore, Week 1 of Term 4 will be another week of remote learning, conducted in the same way we have operating. When students do return in week 2, our COVID-19 policy will still be in place (see website for details).

Our Term 4 Inquiry Theme is Celebrations. This will culminate in the Christmas Concert (restrictions permitting) which has been pencilled in for Thursday 17th December.

We have launched a new School App recently and thank you so much to all the families for joining up so promptly. The app is running very smoothly and will be fitted out with matching branding in coming weeks. Please keep a close eye on the app as this is where most of our communication occurs. The School Stream App has many more features than Flexibuzz and we hope it helps improve communication between the school and family. We will showcase the apps functionalities in the newsletter each fortnight to help optimise its use.

The building works are going very nicely. Almost all of the new classroom windows have been installed. The builders have almost finished relining the coverway and are currently installing steel mesh along the bottom of the walkway walls. This will improve circulation under the building. The Community Centre has received a new ridge cap and roof flashings so that there will no longer be any leaking onto the basketball court after rain. This is a great improvement, making the facility safer and more enjoyable to use.





Department of Education and Training—free parenting webinar and podcast series to families

There are two helpful new resources to help you support your children during remote and flexible learning.

Raising Learners podcast

The Department of Education and Training has funded a 10-episode podcast series through the Raising Children Network called 'Raising Learners'. It features parenting experts from organisations including the Murdoch Children's Research Institute, Career Education Association Victoria, as well as the Australian eSafety Commissioner, Julie Inman-Grant.

Raising Learners provides parents with practical advice, tips and ideas for supporting children's health, wellbeing and engagement at school and at home. Topics include how to connect with your child's school and community, how to best support your child's learning, what to expect for VCE and VCAL students and how to keep your child safe online.

These topics were drawn from common questions that parents raised with the Department's coronavirus (COVID-19) hotline and Parentline.

Although it may still be cold, Victoria's UV levels are on the rise so please check the daily local sun protection times to see when you need to be SunSmart. The **sun protection times** are a forecast from the Bureau of Meteorology for the time of day UV levels are forecast to reach 3 or higher in your location. At these levels, sun protection (hat, clothing, sunscreen, shade and, if practical, sunglasses) is recommended for all skin types.
